

Life of the Parish Faith Formation - Explore 4

A "living" component of our Faith Formation program (4 reflections required for Grades 1-8)

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words... in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise." ~ Deuteronomy 6:5-7 NRSV

Jesus charged us with the mission: "Go and make disciples." We do not have to cross oceans, travel to other continents, or minister to strangers in strange lands, though God may very well call some of us to do this. Instead, most of us will be called to spread the gospel a little closer to home - passing the faith on to the next generation.

Mother Teresa said: "Each person's mission is a mission of love...begin where you are, with the people closest to you." At home, at work, at church, begin with the people closest to you, where you live. It is in the life of the parish that children truly see us being Church together. It is here that they see us living our faith.

We ask parents to "explore four"... explore the four pillars of our faith: Creed, Sacraments/Worship, Christian Prayer, Christian Living through the Life of the Parish. "Explore Four" includes faith opportunities intended to help us explore and grow in our faith. We (and the parish-at-large) provide these opportunities very intentionally to meet people where they are, focused on everyday living of the faith, and learning the traditions of our faith. Some events will be audience specific (for kids/adults only) and others will be intended for all ages, and perfect for whole families. Some events may have an added cost (such as weekend retreats and mission trips). A Life of the Parish Reflection Form is available in the Faith Formation section of our website - www.stjudes.org - and in the Faith Formation Office. After attending/participating in any of these events, fill out the reflection form, and turn in the completed form at your next Families Living Faith/Families Called to the Table or JHYM session. Events are listed on the form.

Families Living the Gospel

A "living" component of our Faith Formation program

In 2014-15, St. Jude Family Faith Formation was awarded a Ministry Grant from the Catholic Education Foundation of the Diocese of Joliet. The grant was awarded to support our Families Living the Gospel initiative. We hope to follow the lead of Pope Francis as he has called us to become a "Missionary Church" and a "Church of Mercy." At this year's Families Living Faith/Families Called to the Table parent sessions, we will be exploring the Corporal Works of Mercy. Families are encouraged to perform works of service and mercy each month, then complete and turn in a Families Living the Gospel Reflection form to enter their family in the Works of Mercy Challenge. Up to two of these reflection forms may also count toward the Explore Four expectation. It is our hope that this will enable our families to spend quality time together, learn about their community's needs and become empowered to live the message of compassion and love proclaimed in the Gospel.

*St. Jude Faith Formation won a National Award from the National Conference on Catechetical Leadership for our Life of the Parish component called Explore 4. National Catholic leaders call it innovative, catechizing & evangelizing. Author/Speaker Joe Paprocki wrote about St. Jude's Faith Formation program for the Catholic publisher Loyola Press, and U.S. Catholic News published a story in 2015 talking about our Family Faith program. We are thrilled to partner with you on this faith journey.

Life of the Parish Faith Formation

NCCL awarded St. Jude the 2014 New Wineskins Award for this Life of the Parish Faith Formation Program!

Our holistic approach to Faith Formation came from an intense study and reflection by our Faith Formation Board and Staff of documents written by our U.S. Catholic Bishops. *The Parish is the Curriculum!* Please see our Life of the Parish (Explore Four) Packet for a full description/explanation of this parish life focus.

Because this approach is focused on forming ourselves and our children in the Catholic faith by full participation in the *life of the parish*, Explore Four events focus on **PARISH** opportunities for being formed in the faith. Most community events, though positive in nature and intent, **do not count** as Explore Four events.

Occasionally, a parish group will participate in a community event together - these types of event do count as Explore Four events, because the parish community participates together. Certain diocesan events also help us grow in our faith and build up our local community as well as our universal Catholic Church. If an event is not a St. Jude parish or Joliet Diocese event, please do not list it as an Explore 4 event. Some multi day events (like Christ Renews His Parish/Welcome weekends) count as two Explore 4 events. Up to two Families Living the Gospel reflection forms can be used for Explore 4. If you have questions about whether an event can be included or not, please call our office at 815-463-4260/463-4262.

ALL AGES-Preparation for the Reception of Sacraments

There is a two year preparation period for the reception of sacraments in the Diocese of Joliet as mandated by the Office of the Bishop. This preparation is in addition to regular and ongoing faith formation! Generally children in the second grade are considered as having reached the age of reason, and thus ready to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. In these younger grades, children receive two years of religious instruction with additional preparation for the sacraments in the second year (second grade). If a child arrives in the second grade, this will be their first year of instruction and sacramental preparation will begin in the third grade. If a child arrives after this time, a similar process will be followed and the child will be placed in their grade level classroom. This is because preparation for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our parish takes the form of family instruction. This is a faith journey for all of us as we renew our understanding of and commitment to the gift of grace we receive in the sacraments. After all gathered sacrament preparation family sessions, activity materials will be sent home with the families. Parents are expected to continue sacramental preparation at home. These family preparation sessions count toward the family "Explore Four" requirement. There will be one preparation session for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Children will then have the opportunity to receive the sacrament in the weeks that follow this session. There will be a family Retreat and family practice for First Eucharist. The dates for the reception of the Sacrament of First Eucharist will be assigned by class. Families may also choose to have their children receive First Eucharist at a Sunday celebration of the Liturgy.

During preparation for Confirmation in the junior high years, BOTH 7th and 8th grade youth receive two years of religious instruction AND additional sacramental preparation. This sacramental preparation takes the form of retreats, special stewardship opportunities, a focus on the importance or regular Mass attendance, and content specific workshops (Catholic Skills Workshops I-2 and Confirmation Prep sessions I-3). The content specific workshops are intended for both youth and their parents and can also count toward the "Explore Four" requirement with parent participation.

Students often show up in our program in the older grades in need of First Reconciliation/First Eucharist. Each of these situations will be handled in a pastoral manner; often these students and parents will meet with a faith formation team leader over the period of two years outside of the regular instruction sessions. Each case will be considered on an individual basis, but **two years of formal instruction and preparation is the** *minimum*. Students who have missed years of faith formation may be required to make up that formation. If a child comes from another program or another school, they still will be expected to go through our preparation sessions. Exceptions may be made if the director/principal of their former program provides us with written testimony to the fact that the youth has received preparation under their direction, and in accordance with the Diocese of Joliet or their home diocese.

If a child has not yet been baptized after he/she reaches the age of reason (approximately 7 years of age), please contact the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation regarding special preparation for your child. If an adult desires to receive the Sacraments or is an adult who wishes to become Catholic, please call the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation for specific instructions on who they should contact and how they too can prepare for the Sacraments as adults. We look forward to this special preparation with you and your family!

Sunday School (PreSchool-Kindergarten)

The Early Childhood years are an important time in a child's faith formation journey. The young child has a unique understanding of God's Unconditional Love, and a natural receptivity to the awe and wonder of the Mystery of God. The St. Jude Sunday School program uses a balanced curriculum targeting the young child's open heart with tangible experiences of God's presence through lessons from the 7 Catholic doctrinal themes which are taught in a spiraling curriculum throughout the Pre-K through 8th grade years. This program includes prayer experiences, crafts, music, and games, which are all developmentally designed for your child's particular age and stage of life. Students are dropped off at their assigned classroom just prior to the 9am Mass and picked up immediately following Mass on assigned Sundays during the school year.

Families Living Faith (Grades 1-6)

In our Families Living Faith program, children in grades I- 6 and their families come together for an hour and a half session, once per month. In these sessions students are introduced to a new unit of study by catechists in age-appropriate classrooms. At the same time, parents participate in exploring these same concepts through adult presentations and small and large group discussions. Parents then teach the next two chapters of the unit at home and children complete the unit review before the next class.

In the past we have had speakers from our own parish, as well as visiting speakers. Some months parents are exposed to the latest research about kids at various ages and stages; other months parents are given ideas about how to unpack the lessons of the current unit using various resources, including media and technology. Every month the theme and the methods may vary, but the friendships and the camaraderie continue to grow. Our faith journey is lifelong, and never ends.

Lessons follow the seven thematic units of the children's curriculum. Families meet once a month to explore these units. Families are also expected to explore four (or more) life of the parish events that support faith formation in the areas of *Creed, Sacraments/Worship, Christian Prayer, Christian Living* (see details on page 2). Sacramental Preparation also counts toward Explore Four. Families are expected to complete and turn in four or more *Explore Four* reflection forms each year. In addition, Catholic Mass reflections are expected to be turned in monthly, and families are encouraged to participate in the Families Living the Gospel Challenge.



Families Living Faith will be offered at the following times throughout the month. Families sign up for a session time and attend that session time throughout the year. Registrations will be accepted in the order they are received - beginning on **April 9, 2018**.

Children must be registered for the babysitting program. Please request a nanny ministry registration form if interested. Availability at each FLF session is limited due to space. Please register ASAP to receive first choice in schedule. We will make every effort to honor your request, but placements are made in the order that registration paperwork is received.

Families Called to the Table (Grades 1-6)

A home study faith formation program in which families receive curriculum support through our publisher, including children's workbooks, and online support for parents and youth. Parents are expected to attend any regularly offered parent session each month and teach all chapters of the unit at home. We encourage families to connect faith formation to liturgy by providing "Magnifikid" magazines 32 weeks of the year. Families will participate in family sacramental preparation and/or "Explore Four" events, and turn in completed reflection forms. Families also complete and turn in monthly Catholic Mass reflections and are encouraged to participate in Families Living the Gospel Challenge. Children (Ist-3rd grade) are invited to participate in Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) when scheduled. Parents of children in Ist-3rd grade are asked to assist at CLOW periodically throughout the year. CLOW is scheduled at 9am and I I am Masses most weeks September through May, except Christmas, New Year's and Easter breaks, and Catholic Schools Week. Our goals are to engage junior high teens and their parents, to evangelize and inspire a renewed understanding of the Catholic faith, and to invite them into a deeper relationship with Jesus. This high-energy and dynamic program will regularly emphasize four cornerstones: Participation, Faith Growth, Fellowship, and Stewardship. The youth meet once or twice a month at scheduled times for meaningful experiences of prayer, worship, scripture, community service and catechesis within a relational context. The catechetical sessions are Sundays at 4:45pm or Mondays at 6:30pm for an hour and a half. (Register for one or the other). In addition, 7th grade teens are required to attend the two Catholic Skills Workshops (Scripture and Christian Prayer) and 8th grade teens must attend three Confirmation Prep Sessions. Corresponding Parent Sessions are offered on Catholic Skills and Confirmation Prep Nights; parents' attendance counts for "Explore Four" with a written reflection form turned in (see page 2 for details). Both 7th and 8th grade teens also need to attend one retreat each year, participate in a variety of service projects, and turn in monthly Family Catholic Mass Reflections and one Stewardship Log with a Stewardship Reflection in April.
